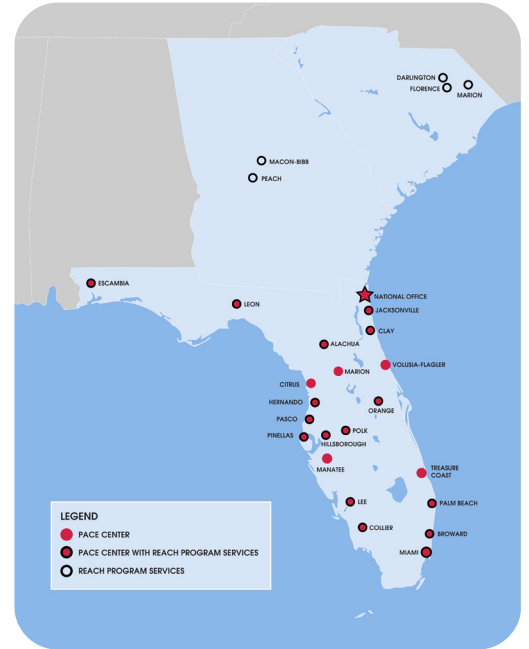


FAST FACTS 2025
