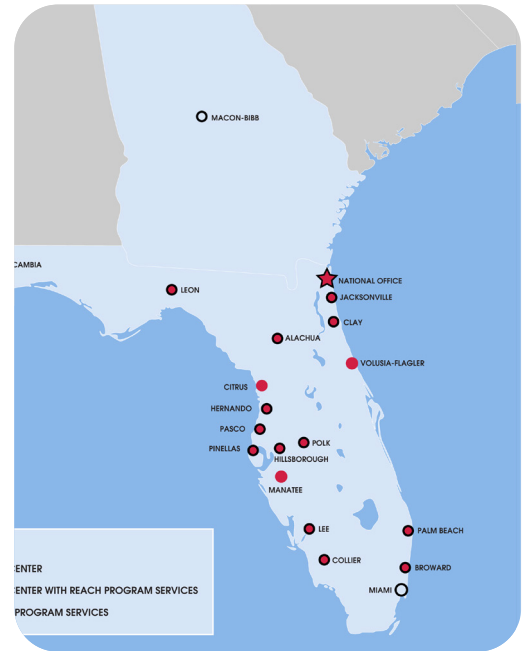


# FAST FACTS 2026
